Main Task

Main Task

We have a problem solving task for you today. How are you with synonyms, active voice, passive voice and formal language? Do you think you have what it takes to solve the mystery?

You have been provided with a set of problem cards.

These cards can be set up around the room or you can solve the problem at a table. The choice is yours.

You need a set of clue cards-There are 8 in total. Follow the instructions on each of the clue cards to reveal a number. Eg, in card one you need to find out how many of the words end in -ence? The number of words is the answer.

Record your answers onto the answer recording sheet (attached below) for each of the given clues.

Remember, if you are stuck or find your clue card a little
