Activity	You will need: Victory in Europe Day sheets, Task I Share and discuss the information on 'Victory in Europe Day' sheet with your child. Use the information to answer questions about VE Day.	You will need: Party picnic planning sheet, Task I Recall how people celebrated VE Day in 1945 from yesterday. Discuss the types of foods you could prepare for a party picnic in the garden on Friday. Help your child to plan (through drawing and listing/labelling) their picnic ideas. Task 2 Many people on Friday will wear red, white and blue clothing. Encourage your child to plan the clothing that they will wear.	You will need: Paper, coloured pencils/pens/crayons/chalks, scissors, tape/glue, Task I Explain how people decorated their homes/windows with flags, bunting and banners to celebrate the end of the war. Make some crafts to decorate your home/window/garden on Friday. Possible craft ideas: Union jack flag Red, white and blue paper chains Red, white and blue bunting Union jack chalk patterns VE Day colouring sheet	You will need: Vera Lynn – We'll meet again https://www.youtube.com/watch?v=OJKMji2688M Task I Listen to the song 'We'll meet again' by Vera Lynn. Explain that Vera Lynn was a British singer whose musical recordings and performances were enormously popular during the Second World War. Encourage your child to begin to learn some of the lyrics and join in singing the song.	You will need: Party picnic food items, VE day decorations, Task I Help your child to decorate the house/garden/windows with the crafts they created. Task 2 Encourage your child to help make food items for their party picnic in the garden. Have fun!

- · On May 7th 1945, Germany surrendered the war.

- · People waved flags.

surrender - to agree to stop fighting
















