In the resources, I have added a little slogan that I have seen a lot over the past weeks: 'Not all superheroes wear capes'. Superheroes are anyone who helps us. Talk to your family about who you think is a superhero and why. <p>Independent</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> I would like you to design your own superhero today. You could base your idea on one of your favourite superheroes or design one of your own. Before you begin to draw, think about what their superpowers are and how they use them. Once you have drawn your superhero, I would like you 	<p>Main</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> Today I would like you to think about what sort of questions you would ask your superhero if you could interview them. Remember to choose some interesting question words to begin your sentences and don't forget your question marks at the end. I have put some examples of the types of questions you could use, in the resources. It might be helpful to talk about these questions with an adult first. <p>Independent</p> <p>Write between 4 and 6 questions that you could ask your superhero.</p>	<p>Main</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> Today we are going to write about what our superhero can do. Look at the questions you wrote yesterday and think about how your superhero would answer them. Don't forget to try and include some detail in your writing and using some connectives in your sentences to make them longer eg: and, but, because, so. <p>Independent</p> <p>Write about your superhero, remembering to add as much detail as you can.</p>

Captain Tom was born in 1920 in Yorkshire. When he was younger, he was in the army and even fought in the Second World War. He now lives with his family in Bedfordshire.



Raising Money

Captain Tom decided to raise money for the NHS to say thank you to them for working so hard for everybody. He spent some time in hospital himself a few years ago, when he had a hip operation. He set himself the challenge of walking 100 laps around his garden before his 100th birthday on 30th April 2020.

Why Is He Famous?

Captain Tom set himself a target of raising £1000, but he reached this in one day. As word quickly spread about what he was doing, people around the world were impressed by his determination and more and more money was donated.

He walked ten laps every day, with the help of a walking frame and while wearing his medals.



Captain Tom Moore

So far, he has raised over 27 million pounds and had good luck messages from all over the world!

Captain Tom even finished his target laps two weeks before his 100th birthday. Soldiers formed a guard of honour for his last few laps, which were filmed and shown on the news worldwide. He has been called a 'National Hero'. He has said he will keep on walking as long as he can raise money.

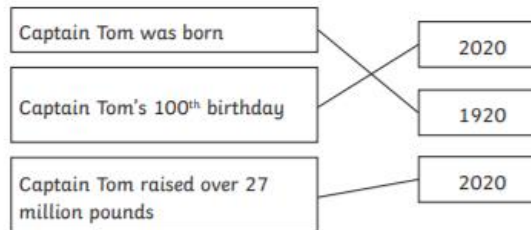

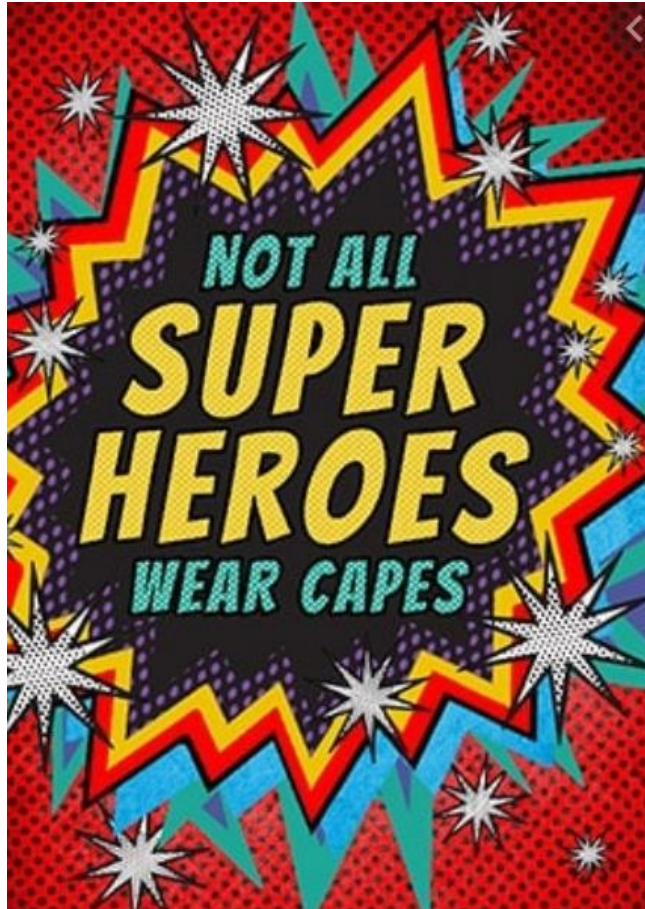

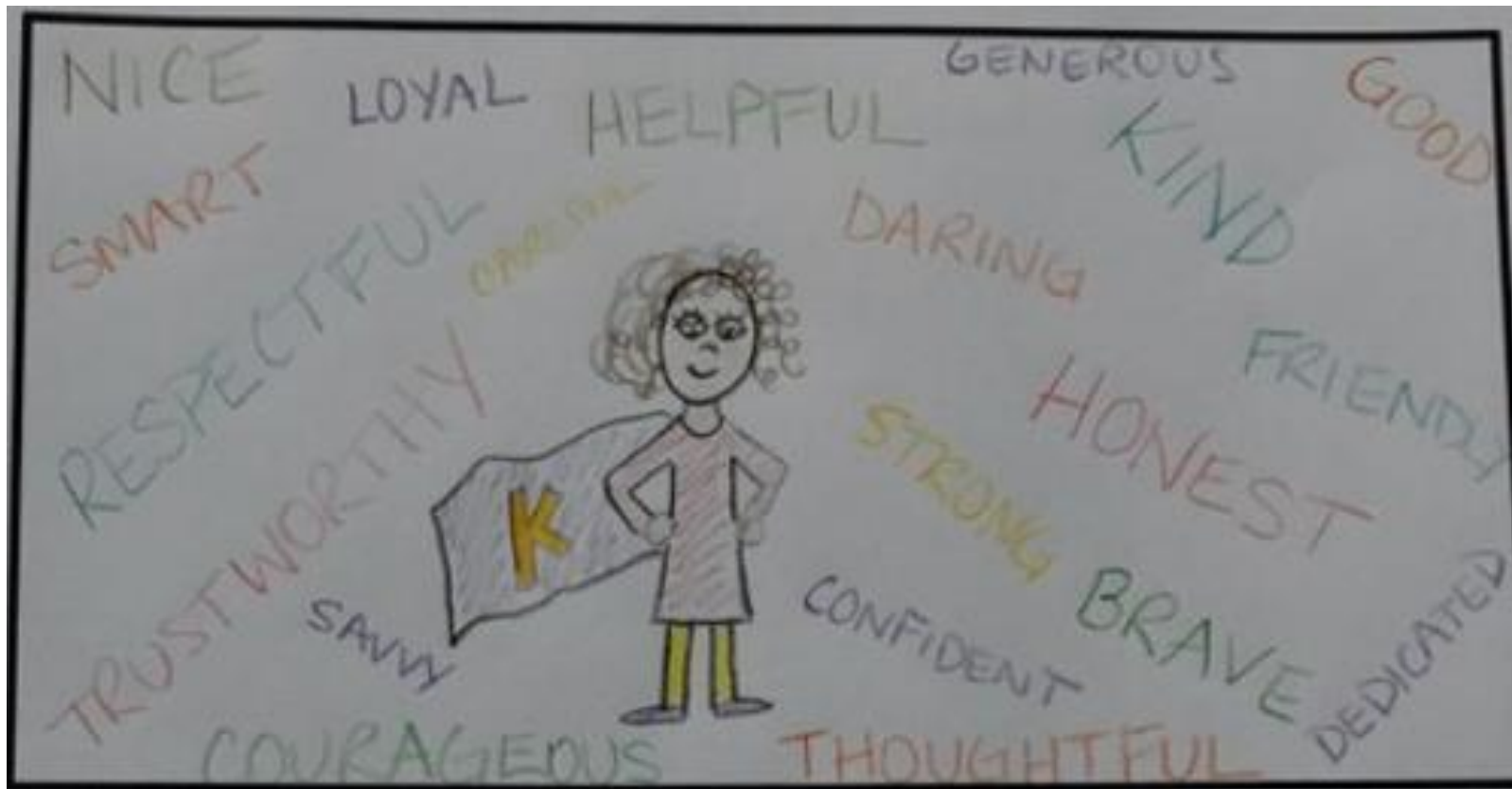
