think?... For questions like these, you will need to read the text to help you with your answers and in some cases, provide evidence from the text to support your answers.

The answers are included but try not to look until you have answered the questions as best you can.

Examples - Nouns

Task – complete the nouns and verbs sheet. Colour the words which act as nouns one colour and the verbs in a different colour.

Main Task

Following from the starter task, can you complete the additional verbs and nouns sheet.
Answers are included for when you complete your tasks.

Eg - Mice adore cheese. The footballer kicked the ball. The catdrank the milk.

A sentence is in the passive voice when the subject (noun) is acted on by the verb. The passive voice always contains a form of 'to be' (be, am, is, are, was, were, being, been) and a past tense verb. That sounds much more complicated than it is - passive voice can actually be quite easy to spot.

Eg - Cheese is adored by mice. The ball was kicked by the footballer.

The milk was drunk by the cat

Passive voice can be usually identified though the use of 'by' in the sentence.

Main Task


How long do you think it will take?

You might already know the name of the recipient eg, Dear PCSO Stephenson, Dear Mr Smith etc. • How will you begin your letter? What will you include in your first paragraph? Don't forget that the first paragraph is like an introduction and so you need to explain why you are writing eg, I am writing to you to express my thanks.....I am writing to you to say thank you • How will you end your letter? What will you write in your final sentence/paragraph. At the end of the letter how will you sign off eg,

Yours Faithfully or Yours Sincerely?
