Activity	<p>Spelling, Punctuation and Grammar (SPaG)</p> <p>Today I would like you to practise some SPaG skills. The mat contains a number of short activities based on reading, spelling, and writing. It should help your child practise their basic writing skills and recap some tricky spellings.</p> <p>In school, your child has learned that we use a capital letter: at the beginning of a sentence, for the name of a person or a place (eg. Sam, Durham), and for I.</p> <p>Your child may need support with reading the instructions of each task.</p> <p>I have included a second SPaG mat which provides more of a challenge if needed.</p>	<p>Reading Comprehension</p> <p>Today I would like you to practise some reading skills.</p> <p>Read the text below 'Superheroes' and try to answer the questions about the text.</p> <p>This activity allows children to practise their reading but allows you to check they understand what they have read.</p> <p>If your child struggles to read some of the text themselves, please read it with them and talk about any words they do not know. Even if a child cannot read the words, they might still understand what they mean if someone reads it to them, so they can still have a go at the questions.</p>	<p>LC: Can you use capital letters and full stops accurately in sentences?</p> <p>Today's exercise will practise using capital letters, finger spaces and full stops.</p> <p>1 - Use a capital letter and a full stop to complete the sentence about Batman.</p> <p>2 - Unscramble the words to create a sentence about the 2 superheroes.</p> <p>3 - Think of your own sentence about a superhero. Don't forget to use capital letters, finger spaces and full stops.</p>	<p>LC: Can you label superheroes and villains using adjectives?</p> <p>Today you will think of some adjectives to describe some heroes and villains. Think about their appearance and their special strengths and powers.</p> <p>You can use the 'Hero' and 'Villain' word mats to help if you are stuck.</p> <p>Task: Under each picture make a list of 3 or 4 words you could use to describe that hero or villain.</p>	<p>LC: Can you create your own Superhero?</p> <p>Think about the heroes that you have read about, or seen on TV and in films. Your challenge is to design your own superhero. You need to think about the following questions:</p> <p>-What is your superhero called? -What does your hero look like? -What do they wear? -What powers do they have? -How did they get their powers?</p> <p>You can use the Superhero word mat for ideas, or use your own imagination. Complete the 'My Superhero Identity' sheet and draw a picture of your hero.</p>
