

# Pick a selection of activities from the grid below that equal at least 30 minutes of active learning.

	15 minute challenge	Floor Ladder	Hunt
15 minutes	Choose an activity and practise for 15 minutes.  Brisk walk Jog  Scooter/bike ride  Skipping skills Hoola hooping skills	Use 8 socks to make the rungs of the ladder on the floor. How many different ways can you move through the ladder? E.g. walk, walk with high knees, run, hop, jump, hopscotch, sideways shuffle.	Hide different objects (e.g. toys/teddies) around your home or garden.  Set children the challenge of moving around the space to find all the objects.

	Standing long jump	Around the world	Kangaroo Jumping
10 minutes	Place a starting marker on the floor.  Standing beside the marker on 2 feet, how far can you jump landing balanced on 2 feet?  Can you practise jumping in different ways? E.g. from 1 foot to 2 feet, from 1 foot to 1 foot	How many times can you pass an object around your waist in 60 seconds?  If you drop the object, you need to start again.  Repeat the activity and try to beat your score.  Can you move the object around or through different parts of your body? E.g. under your legs.	Talk about how kangaroos move.  Try moving like a kangaroo—hands are held in front of chest with elbows bent, jump from 2 feet and land on 2 feet, bending knees slightly on landing.  Try and kangaroo hop around your room or garden.
5 minutes	Socks in the box  How many socks can you pair up and put in the box in 60 seconds?  Place unpaired socks 5 steps away from a box.  Children run, match up a pair of socks and run back to put them in the box.  Keep count and try to beat your score.	Can you balance a toilet roll on your head while standing still? Challenge yourself to balance a toilet roll on your head while moving. How many different types of movement can you do while balancing the toilet roll on your head? Can you balance the toilet roll on different parts of your body?	Place a sock on the floor.  Can you jump side to side over the sock?  How many jumps can you do in 60 se conds?  Repeat the activity and try to beat you score.
