Activity	More chocolate this week! However, today we are looking at how igneous rocks are formed. To start, watch the video below about how igneous rocks are formed - https://www.youtube.com/watch?v=PrN7jygu4cQ And now for the chocolate — you will need dark, milk and white chocolate chips (you could also use broken chocolate bars if you cannot find chocolate chips). The heat will come from hot (but not boiling) water — make sure there is an adult helper for this part.	We are going to be looking at different ways to make masks – Egyptians used many different techniques too. We could use paper (papyrus) or papier mâché. We could even make them from salt dough or clay. Discuss the medium you would like to use with your adult helper. Have a look on the internet for some Egyptian masks that have been discovered. You could either recreate a design that you like in your medium – or you could use features of them all to create your own mask.


