<u>LC</u>	YI: Can you write facts about the gunpowder plot? Y2:	YI: Can you write information about staying safe on bonfire night?
	<ul> <li>Display the date on the board (5th November). Ask the children if they know why this date is significant? Take ideas and explain to the children that 5th November is bonfire night. What is bonfire night about?</li> <li>Show the children the information powerpoint about the Gunpowder Plot.</li> <li>Explain to the children that they are going to write a fact file about the gunpowder plot. Recap Non fiction with the children and talk about captions that are facts – true information</li> <li>Look at the pictures from the powerpoint and put them in order and discuss sentences together.</li> <li>Year 1: add labels / captions to pictures from the Gunpowder plot. Use word mat for scaffold and T/TA support with labels.</li> <li>Year 2: Use pictures from the powerpoint to support fact writing about the Gunpowder plot.</li> </ul>	<ul> <li>Recap the previous lesson about the Gunpowder Plot. Ask the children if they have ever been to a firework display or a bonfire before.</li> <li>Explain to the children that they can be lots of fun but there are also some dangers. What could they be?</li> <li>Show the children Firefighter Fred's Bonfire Night Safety Show powerpoint story and recap the safety rules afterwards.</li> <li>Year I: Create a poster by drawing a picture (or children to add labels or captions) Record a sentence for Seesaw about staying safe on bonfire night.</li> <li>Year 2: Write a set of instructions for staying safe on bonfire night thinking about Fred's safety rules.</li> </ul>
