

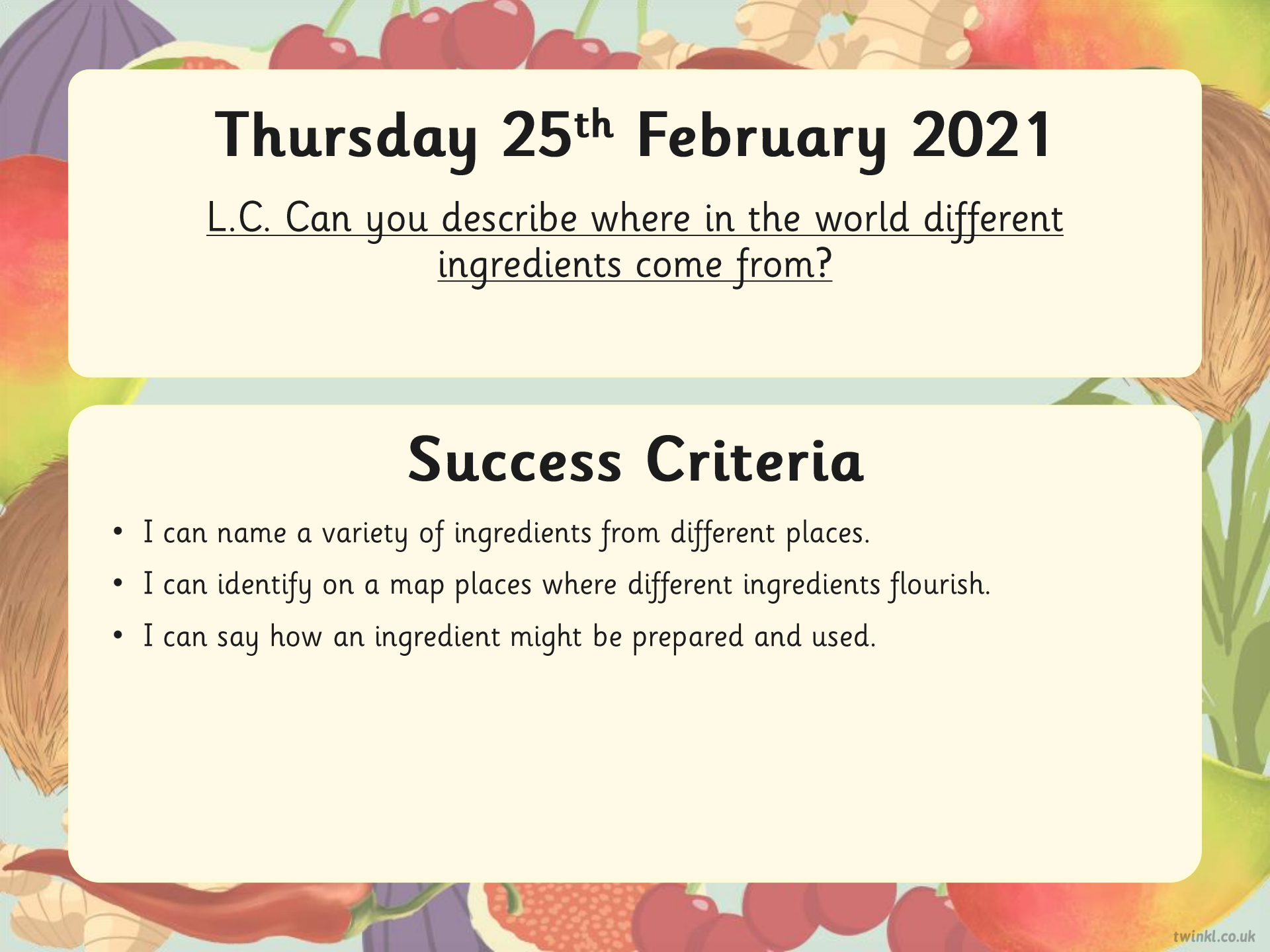

- Why might we need to import some of our ingredients?

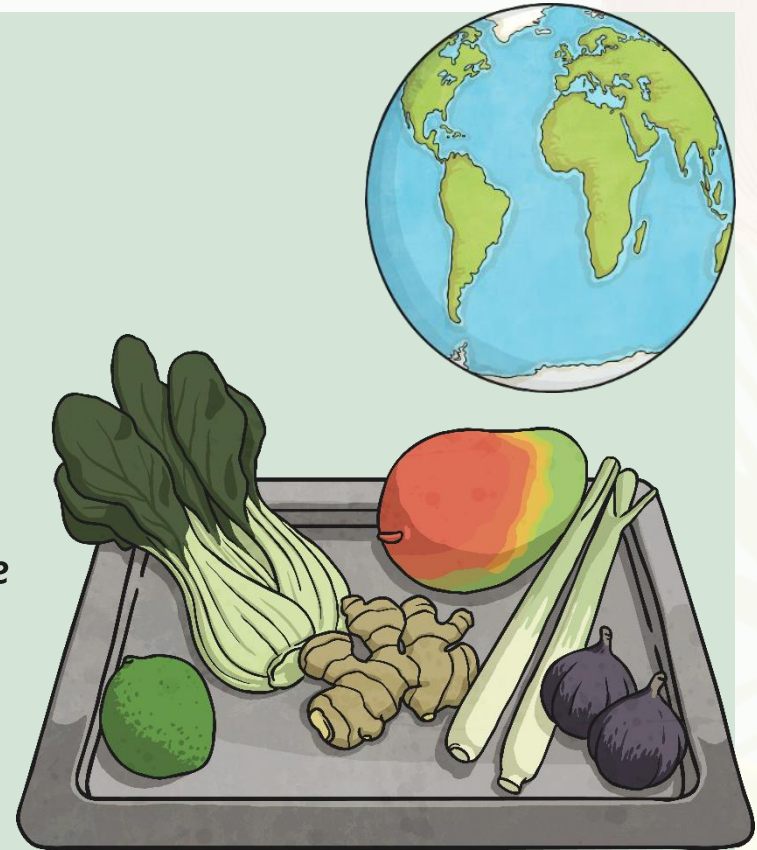
# UK Imports

Why do we need to import some of our foods?



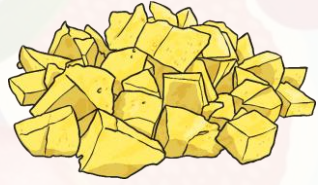


# You can find out where a product is from by looking at the packaging and labels on our food:

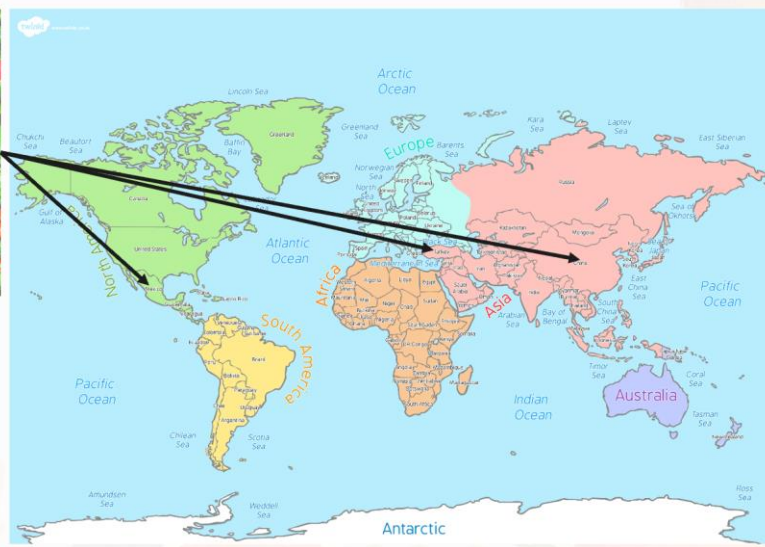
# Use in foods



Depending on how readily available some of these ingredients are, you will see them play a central role in different cuisines around the world.



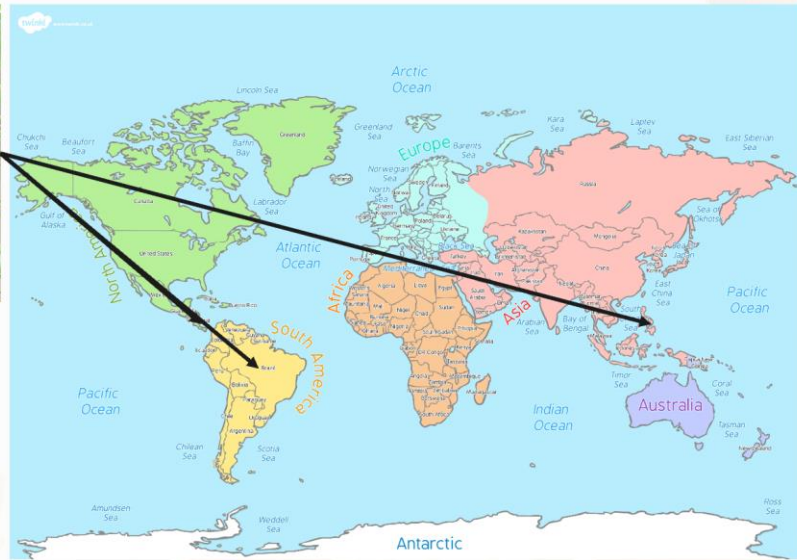
Chillies can be found in China, Mexico and Turkey.

Pineapple can be found in the Philippines, Brazil and Costa Rica.





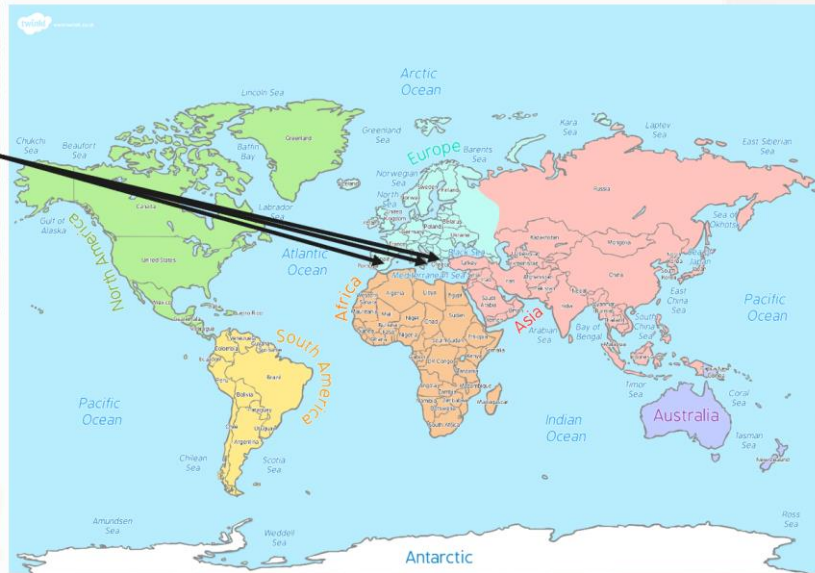

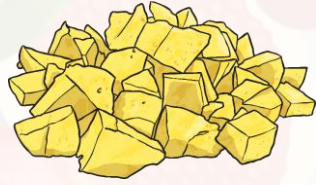
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Cherries can be found in Spain, Italy and Greece.
