LC	Can you write instructions for making Jelly?	Can you write a recount?
	Recap the story from last week (Jellyfish are Disgusting) and ask the children to think about what happened in the story. What did Burt want to eat instead of jellyfish? Jelly.	Following an under the sea party with games, music, food. Remind the children about what is needed when we write a recount. Time conjunctions, chronological order, first person, past tense.
	Explain to the children that we are going to make jelly to have at our under the sea party and that they need to write instructions so that other people know how to make it too.	Talk about what we did at the party. What was your favourite part? Which games did you play? What did you eat?
	Model making jelly and talk through each step. Leave the jelly to set to eat at the party.	Model writing a recount on the board. Use a checklist of the features to make sure we have included them all. Also check for CL, FS, FS.  Activity: Write a recount of the under the sea party.
	Talk to the children about when we have written instructions before. Remind them a bout using time conjunctions and ask for some examples (first, then, finally etc). Ask the children to think about verbs (doing words) and which verbs we might use when making jelly (cut, pour, stir, mix etc). Model drawing a picture of each step of making jelly and talk through an appropriate instruction. Check we have used time conjunction and imperative verb.	Differentiation: T/TA support with scribing where needed or record on seesaw talking about each part of the party.
	Activity: Children to use instructions template to draw pictures of each step and write an instruction. Use time	

conjunctions and imperative verbs.	
Differentiation: Some children to draw pictures and orally tell	
their instructions to T/TA.	

Additional Classroom Activities: Write a Jellyfish Acrostic Poem, Draw and label a Jellyfish, research Jellyfish and share facts with friends, write a book review.
